Approximately 1 mile away from the museum is the Great Central Railway Leicester North Railway Station who is able to provide a wedding reception with a difference on a moving train which would need to be arranged separately with the Railway.



Ceremonies at the Abbey Pumping Station can be held on a Monday to Friday at 11.00am, 2.30pm or 3.00pm and on a Saturday, Sunday or Bank Holiday at 11.00am, 1.00pm or 3.00pm.

Couples are required to arrange the Registrars independently to conduct the ceremony for which there is a separate Registrars fee.
